# **LEARNING GARDEN – Shirley Model (March 4, 2020)**

- The gardening year has begun for us. We have made 3 trips to haul in our supplies of 28 bags of sea soil for containers (these were big heavy bags) and 28 bags of manure (lighter and easier to handle). We know now that next year we will require at least 3 more bags of sea soil.
- On 2 dry days, we spread all the soil and manure we require for now and are waiting for the soil and weather to warm a little before proceeding further. The cold miserable wind does not encourage any of use to be in the garden for very long.
- We have covered the beds with stocks to discourage the racoons and skunks from eating our worms which appear to be increasing in number.
- The garlic is growing well, and we hope to have a larger crop this year.
- We do want Anne Ladouceur to come to our March 16 meeting @ 2:30 pm as we are not prepared but will be for the April elections.
